Healthy Living With Diabetes

Mondays; September 23– October 28; 1:00a-3:30p

Maybe you took some things for granted - like eating what you want, when you want, or taking a break from exercise. Then you found out you have diabetes. Now managing your medications and lifestyle feels like a fulltime job. It can be overwhelming.

Healthy Living with Diabetes (HLWD) is a high-level, evidence-based workshop for people who have diabetes. Developed at Stanford University, the workshop meets for 2-1/2 hours, once a week, for six weeks. This community-based program offers tools and resources to enhance your understanding of what it means to have diabetes. Group support helps you build the confidence to manage your diabetes and maintain an active and fulfilling life. It is facilitated by two trained leaders in a small group setting. Each week has various topics related to mental, physical, and emotional wellbeing, created to gain knowledge, share experiences, practice new skills, and help others.

The Aging & Disability Resource Center of Vilas County is offering this workshop here at Peace Lutheran Church. This is a six week series that will meet on Mondays beginning September 23rd. Class size is limited and pre-registration is required. To register, contact Amie at 715-479-3625.
